

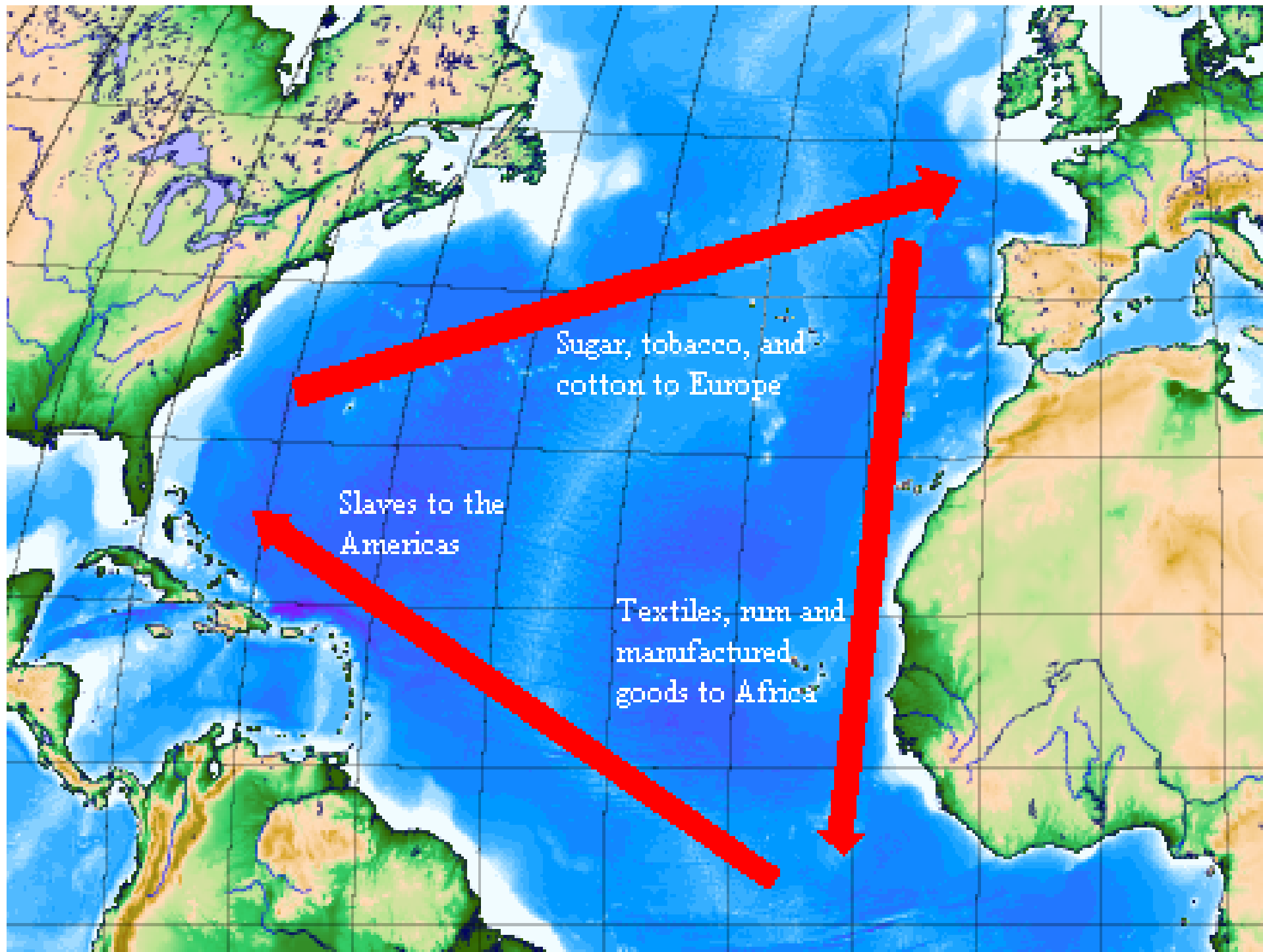
# Triangular Trade

# More info

- The journeys were known as the Outward passage, the Middle Passage and the Home passage
- The voyage from Britain to Africa took about 40 days
- West Africa to West Indies- 38 days
- West Indies to Britain – 50-60 days
